



Archbishop Spalding High School Sister Lucidus - Pioneer Scholarship

The first principal of the school now known as Archbishop Spalding High School was Sister Lucidus, a Sister of Notre Dame de Namur. The foundress of the Sisters of Notre Dame, Marie Rose Julie Billiart, was canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1969. He said on the day of her canonization "We do not create, we do not confer saintliness; we recognize it, we proclaim it!" This scholarship is intended to recognize and proclaim outstanding good works, leadership, and pioneering spirit in young people entering Archbishop Spalding High School. To be considered for this scholarship all applicants:

1. Provide a list all awards, honors, and outstanding achievements in grades six through eight.
2. Provide a list all school, church, and community activities in which you have been involved.
3. Provide a letter of recommendation from your current Principal, Guidance counselor, or other school Administrator..
4. Schedule a personal meeting with the Director of Admissions (if you have not already had one).
5. Parent/Guardian(s) provide a letter describing why, in their view, the applicant is deserving of a scholarship.
6. Submit an essay discussing the "saintliness" you have recognized in your own life both in people you have encountered as well as those whom you admire as leaders or pioneers in the world.
